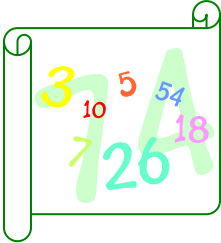

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

| SUBJECT | CONTENT |
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| Communication and Language Literacy | In line with the EYFS curriculum, children will continue their learning of phonics through the Unlocking Letters and Sounds Programme. They will focus on: <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Speaking confidently in different situations◆ Knowing what 'good listening' should look like, looking at the speaker, keeping our body still and our voices off.◆ The development of independent writing and encourage good letter formation◆ Learning their phase 2 sounds and Common Exception Words, recognising these and attempting to write them. |
| Mathematics | Children will: <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Know how to sort objects into groups using different categories.◆ Know that numbers can be represented using our fingers.◆ Know how to count by rote.◆ Know when there are more or fewer than or when two groups are the same.◆ Know and uses the vocabulary large/small, big/little, full, empty, heavy/light to make comparisons.◆ Know how to create a simple pattern. |
| Understanding of the World | The children will cover the subject areas of: science, history, geography, RE and PSHE . The topics will be delivered through our topic question 'I wonder what makes something special?' Children will: <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Know 3 ways in which they have changed since being a baby.◆ Know some ways in which houses and clothes were different in the past.◆ Know the names of family members.◆ Know that during harvest time the farmer gathers in the crops.◆ Know that in autumn many leaves turn red, orange, yellow or brown and fall off trees.◆ Know the name of conkers and acorns◆ Further explore the local environment through 'Welly Walks' |
| Expressive Art and Design | Children will develop craft and design skills through: <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Develop fine motor skills through cutting, sticking, threading and joining alongside other crafts◆ Develop a range of sculpture skills with a variety of materials e.g. clay, playdough◆ Develop enjoyment of music through singing and listening to a wide variety of music and rhymes |
| Physical Development | Through team games, children will incorporate ball skills as well as the use of small apparatus. They will: <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Develop co-ordination through tennis and outdoor sports◆ Improve overall body strength, balance, co-ordination and agility◆ Develop awareness of ways to keep their body healthy |

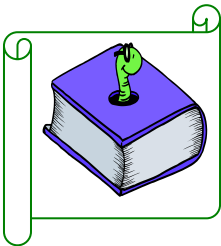


MATHEMATICS

Continue to practise number formation and counting to 10 and beyond at home.

To practise representing numbers on their fingers.

To practise vocabulary large/small, big/little, full/empty, heavy/light to make comparisons.



LITERACY AND PHONICS

To continue to practise correct letter formations.

To complete weekly phonics sheets at home.
