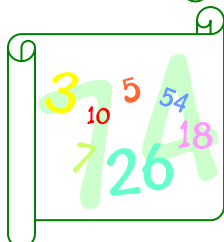

Dear Parents

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	To develop skills of speaking and listening for a wide range of purposes in different contexts. To read and write for a range of purposes by developing word recognition, decoding (reading) and encoding (spelling). Children will be able to understand and interpret different texts and engage and respond to them. They will create texts which work on sentence structure, punctuation, grammar and presentation.
Mathematics	Following the Year 2 Mathematical National Curriculum objectives, children will learn to; <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ develop counting and understanding of number by using number facts◆ develop calculation skills including addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.◆ Improve knowledge of shape and measures and how to handle data.◆ Use and apply mathematics in various contexts and for a range of purposes.
Science	Animals including humans: To understand the life cycle of various animals. To know how humans change from babies to adults. Plants: To understand the conditions needed for plant growth. They classify, observe, and record learning through practical activities.
Computing	Multi-media: - Making Digital Music and Creating Pictograms To use technology to present information. To use technology to create, store and retrieve digital content. Programming: Giving instructions to BeeBots and making algorithms. E-safety: To understand how to use technology safely.
Geography	Continents and Oceans: To be able to use maps and atlases to locate continents and oceans. To develop an understanding of the human and physical features of a place.
History	The Great Fire of London: To develop an understanding of the events surrounding The Great Fire of London. To understand what an eye-witness is. To use timelines, sequence main events and answer questions about the past.
RE	Understanding Christianity: The Gospel and Salvation. Judaism: Looking at the Torah, Synagogues and at Jewish celebrations like Shabbat.
Music	Inventing A Musical Story: To understand tempo and keep a steady beat. To improvise simple rhythms. Recognising Different Sounds: To listen to and recognise musical instruments. To sing as part of a group and solo.
Art	Painting and Mixed Media: To make choices about techniques and materials to create an effect. To use observational skills to inform their own work.
DT	Food: To create a balanced diet using foods from the different food groups.
PE	Invasion Games: Basketball and football Gymnastics: Balancing, rolling and jumping. Outdoor Team Building: Working together to build, move and pass. Cricket: Batting, fielding and bowling skills.
PSHE/RSE	Keeping Safe: To keep safe and deal with secrets alongside how to use medicines appropriately. Rights and Responsibilities: Getting on with others.

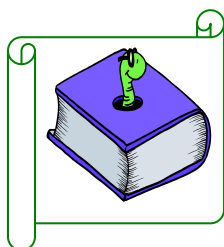


MATHS

Continue to learn 2, 5 and 10 times tables in and out of order.

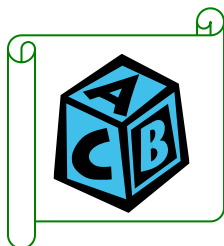
Reinforce number bonds and gain experience of telling the time.



ENGLISH

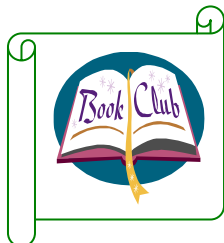
Activities to support and enhance classroom learning, including reading

SPELLING

Your child will bring home a list of spellings on Wednesday. They will need to look, cover, write, check these words and then complete a short activity relating to the words. There will be a spelling test on Wednesday. The test will often include unseen words that are in the same word family or that follow the same spelling pattern.



READING

10-15 minutes reading every day. Please talk with your child about what has been read and record any comments in your child's reading record book. Reading books and reading record books need to come in to school **every day**.

Children are responsible for ensuring that their reading books are changed.

PE - Monday and Thursday

- ◆ Homework is given out on Wednesdays. It is due back in school on the following Wednesday.
