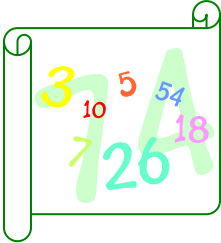
Dear Parents

SUBJECT	CONTENT
Literacy	<p>To continue to teach phonic skills through the 'Unlocking Letters and Sounds Programme'</p> <p>To encourage the development of independent writing and encourage good letter formation.</p> <p>To develop sight vocabulary and continue to read books that include this vocabulary.</p> <p>To encourage children to speak confidently.</p> <p>To develop story writing through reading and writing the Christian stories we hear in class (Jonah and the Whale, Noah's Ark, and the Easter Story).</p>
Mathematics	<p>To recognise and sequence the numbers to 10, to write these confidently and to develop confidence in practical activities e.g. sorting, matching and number games.</p> <p>To begin to find one more and one less to ten.</p> <p>To develop their adding and subtracting skills using practical activities including combining and arranging of groups of objects.</p> <p>To continue to develop knowledge of shape.</p> <p>To complete patterns and arrange objects into pairs.</p> <p>To use correct language to compare weight, height, capacity and length.</p> <p>To organise and sequence events based on time.</p>
Understanding of the World	<p>The subject areas covered are Science, History, Geography, RE, PSHE. The curriculum areas will be delivered through the following topics: Food glorious food (Lunar New Year, Mother's Day, Easter and Valentines Day) Our world and feelings and emotions.</p> <p>To explore the local environment through 'Welly Walks' during Outdoor Learning Sessions.</p> <p>To develop computing skills.</p> <p>To develop understanding of people, communities, and celebrations, past and present and the natural world.</p>
Expressive Art and Design	<p>To develop drawing skills through observational drawing.</p> <p>To improve fine motor skills through cutting, sticking and other craft.</p> <p>To develop a range of painting skills e.g. printing.</p> <p>To develop the children's enjoyment of music through singing and listening to different kinds of music and rhymes.</p>
Physical Development	<p>To introduce team games, incorporating ball skills and the use of small apparatus.</p> <p>To improve co-ordination through dance and movement.</p> <p>To develop overall body strength, balance, co-ordination and agility.</p> <p>To develop awareness of ways to keep my body healthy.</p>

The development of personal, social and emotional skills and communication and language skills are embedded throughout the entire curriculum.

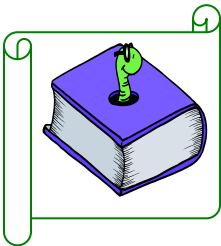

Continue to practise number formation and counting at home.

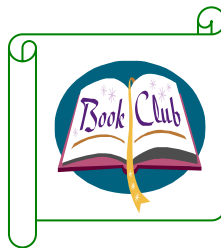
Start to talk about time at home.
