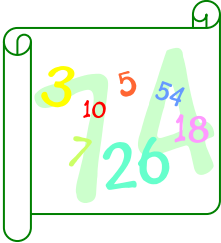

Dear Parents,

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

<b>SUBJECT</b>	<b>CONTENT</b>
<b>Communication and Language</b>  <b>Literacy</b>	In line with the EYFS curriculum, children will continue their learning of phonics through the Unlocking Letters and Sounds Programme. They will focus on: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ Speaking confidently in different situations</li><li>◆ Knowing what 'good listening' should look like, looking at the speaker, keeping our body still and our voices off.</li><li>◆ The development of independent writing and encourage good letter formation</li><li>◆ Learning their phase 2 sounds and Common Exception Words, recognising these and attempting to write them.</li></ul>
<b>Mathematics</b>	Children will: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ Know how to sort objects into groups using different categories.</li><li>◆ Know that numbers can be represented using our fingers.</li><li>◆ Know how to count by rote.</li><li>◆ Know when there are more or fewer than or when two groups are the same.</li><li>◆ Know and uses the vocabulary large/small, big/little, full, empty, heavy/light to make comparisons.</li><li>◆ Know how to create a simple pattern.</li></ul>
<b>Understanding of the World</b>	The children will cover the subject areas of: science, history, geography, RE and PSHE . The topics will be delivered through our topic question 'I wonder what makes something special?' Children will: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ Know 3 ways in which they have changed since being a baby.</li><li>◆ Know some ways in which houses and clothes were different in the past.</li><li>◆ Know the names of family members.</li><li>◆ Know that during harvest time the farmer gathers in the crops.</li><li>◆ Know that in autumn many leaves turn red, orange, yellow or brown and fall off trees.</li><li>◆ Know the name of conkers and acorns</li><li>◆ Further explore the local environment through 'Welly Walks'</li></ul>
<b>Expressive Art and Design</b>	Children will develop craft and design skills through: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ Develop fine motor skills through cutting, sticking, threading and joining alongside other crafts</li><li>◆ Develop a range of sculpture skills with a variety of materials e.g. clay, playdough</li><li>◆ Develop enjoyment of music through singing and listening to a wide variety of music and rhymes</li></ul>
<b>Physical Development</b>	Through team games, children will incorporate ball skills as well as the use of small apparatus. They will: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ Develop co-ordination through tennis and outdoor sports</li><li>◆ Improve overall body strength, balance, co-ordination and agility</li><li>◆ Develop awareness of ways to keep their body healthy</li></ul>

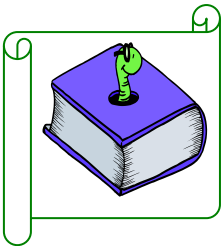


## MATHEMATICS

Continue to practise number formation and counting to 10 and beyond at home.

To practise representing numbers on their fingers.

To practise vocabulary large/small, big/little, full/empty, heavy/light to make comparisons.



## LITERACY AND PHONICS

To continue to practise correct letter formations.

To complete weekly phonics sheets at home.

When your child is sent home with a reading book, this should be read 3 times a week.
