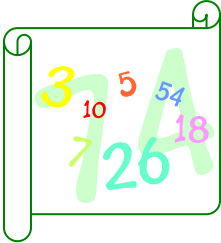
Dear Parents

SUBJECT	CONTENT
<b>Literacy</b>	<p>In line with the EYFS curriculum, phonics skills will be taught through the 'Unlocking Letters and Sounds Programme' They will focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ the development of independent writing and encourage good letter formation</li><li>◆ sight vocabulary and continuing to read books that include this type of vocabulary</li><li>◆ speaking confidently in different situations</li><li>◆ developing hand writing skills with handwriting books</li><li>◆ developing story writing through reading and writing</li></ul>
<b>Mathematics</b>	<p>Children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ recognise, write and sequence numbers to 20 confidently alongside developing confidence in practical activities such as: sorting, sharing and doubling</li><li>◆ further develop adding and subtracting skills and be able to write number sentences</li><li>◆ be able to recall odd and even numbers and number bonds to 10</li><li>◆ continue developing knowledge of 2D &amp; 3D shape</li><li>◆ use correct language to compare weight, height, capacity and length</li><li>◆ count confidently to 20 and beyond as well as by rote backwards from 20</li><li>◆ begin to understand the time in relation to their day</li></ul>
<b>Understanding of the World</b>	<p>The children will cover the subject areas of: science, history, geography, RE, PSHE and Computing. The topics will be delivered through the following topics: 'Once upon a time' and 'Sealife and Fossils'</p> <p>Children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ further explore the local environment through 'Welly Walks'</li><li>◆ continue the development of key computing skills</li><li>◆ continue to develop understanding of people, communities, celebrations, past and present and the natural world</li></ul>
<b>Expressive Art and Design</b>	<p>Children will develop craft and design skills through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ fine motor skills through cutting, sticking, threading and joining alongside other crafts</li><li>◆ develop a range of sculpture skills with a variety of materials e.g. clay, playdough</li><li>◆ develop enjoyment of music through singing and listening to a wide variety of music and rhymes</li></ul>
<b>Physical Development</b>	<p>Through team games, children will incorporate ball skills as well as the use of small apparatus. They will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◆ develop co-ordination through tennis and outdoor sports</li><li>◆ improve overall body strength, balance, co-ordination and agility</li><li>◆ develop awareness of ways to keep their body healthy</li></ul>

The development of personal, social and emotional skills and communication and language skills are embedded throughout the entire curriculum.

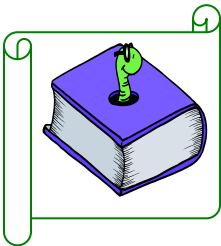

Continue to practise number formation and counting to 20 and beyond at home.

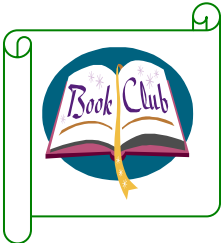
To practise number bonds to 10.
