Dear Parents

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	Children will develop confidence in speaking and listening through discussion, storytelling and drama activities. They will build reading skills through a range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts, developing fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. Children will also begin to write for different purposes, focusing on sentence construction, punctuation and spelling patterns.
Mathematics	Following the Year 2 National Curriculum, children will develop their understanding of number through counting, place value, addition and subtraction, building fluency with number facts to 20. They will begin to explore multiplication and division through the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, arrays and repeated addition, while also applying their maths skills to measures including money, length and time.
Science	Materials: Children will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials and how these are used in everyday life. Staying Healthy: Children will learn how to stay healthy by making good choices about food, exercise, hygiene and wellbeing.
Computing	Computing systems and networks: Children will learn how IT is used in everyday life and benefits society. E-safety: Children will learn how to use technology safely and responsibly. Creating media: Children will learn how to take and create digital photographs.
Geography	Maps: Our School, Our Area, Our World: Children will learn to use maps, atlases and directions to explore, compare and describe places and their human and physical features.
History	Significant events from the past: Children will recognise similarities and differences between our lives and people in the past. To understand the impact of WW1 and Remembrance Day.
RE	Esther: Learn how Esther's courage and faith helped save her people. Women in Religion: Learn how women of faith have inspired others through kindness, bravery and service.
Music	Exploring instruments: Children will play a range of bells musically and begin to understand some music vocabulary like pitch. KS1 Nativity: Children will learn and perform songs for their Year 2 Nativity performance.
PSHE/RSE	Me and my relationships: Children will look at the importance of being a good friend. They will focus on bullying through school rules. Valuing differences: Children will celebrate differences and learn how to be kind to others.
Art	Drawing: Children will develop techniques of form, line, colour, tone and pattern.
DT	Textiles: Children will explore fabric and texture. They will learn how to do a running stitch.
PE	Multi-skills: Children will focus on the skills of running, jumping, throwing and catching whilst developing their co-ordination skills with a focus of working as a team. Dance: The children will perform dances using simple movement patterns.

Activities to support and enhance classroom learning. Also, learning number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 and knowing the 2, 5, 10 and 3 times tables by heart, in and out of order.



ENGLISH

Activities to support and enhance classroom learning. Please keep working on presentation and handwriting, paying particular attention to ascenders, descenders, and placement of letters on the line.



SPELLING

Throughout this term we will be revising the spelling of the key words. Children will be required to learn a weekly list of spellings for a test on a Wednesday.



READING

Daily reading is an essential part of your child's learning and development. We ask that all children read for 10-15 minutes each day, including those who are already fluent readers. Reading can include a variety of books and texts and is not limited to those provided by school.

We encourage you to talk with your child about what they have read, as this helps to develop their understanding and comprehension skills. Please record any reading completed at home in your child's reading record book, as this provides valuable communication between home and school.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- ◆ PE takes place on a **Tuesday** and **Thursday**.
- ◆ Homework is due back on **Wednesday**. Homework is carefully planned to support and consolidate the learning taking place in school. We encourage all children to complete their tasks and return them on time. Wherever possible, homework should be completed independently, although occasional adult guidance may be helpful.
