Dear Parents

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	Children will focus on the Year 3 National Curriculum English objectives, including; phonics, reading, spelling, punctuation, grammar, comprehension skills. Writing skills - fiction/non-fiction, story writing including character descriptions, letters for a range of purposes, script writing, poetry and handwriting.
Maths	Following the Year 3 Mathematical National Curriculum objectives, children will focus on: • Number and place value up to 1000 • Multiples of 4,8,50 and 100 (10 more/10 less) • Addition and subtraction, multiplication and division inc. formal written methods • Fractions inc. shapes, amounts, unit and non-unit fractions, equivalents & adding and subtracting fractions • Measures inc. measuring, comparing, lengths (m/cm/mm), mass (kg/g) and volume and capacity (l/ml) • Geometry inc. 2D shape, right angles, horizontal/vertical/perpendicular/parallel lines
Science	Animals including Humans: Children will identify the right types and amounts of nutrition needed to survive and how animals get their nutrition from what they eat inc. digestion. Forces & magnets: Children will learn that forces are pushes/pulls which make things move, stop or change shape.
Computing	Connecting computers: Children will develop their understanding of digital devices, including inputs, processes Stop-frame animation: Children will use a range of techniques to create a stop-frame animation inc. music and text. E-Safety: Children will agree class internet safety rules and cyberbullying
Geography	Welcome to the United Kingdom: Children will be extending their knowledge beyond the local area to explore the four countries of the United Kingdom. They will be looking at the geographical features of the UK, developing their understanding of how to use an atlas.
French	French: Children will learn basic greetings and begin to learn adjectives of colour size and shape.
RE	Worldviews: Children will learn what is meant by a worldview through exploration of religious and non religious worldviews. The nature of God in Christianity and the incarnation: Children will develop an understanding of what is it like to follow God and Christians belief of incarnation.
Music	Composition: Children will develop an understanding of musical composition, organising and manipulating ideas within musical structures and reproducing sounds from aural memory.
DT	Cross Stitch and Applique: Children will develop skills in textile art by designing and creating personal flags using cross-stitch and appliqué techniques. They will explore identity and symbolism through the selection of colours, patterns, and motifs that reflect their individual backgrounds, values, and interests.
PE	Games: Children will learn a variety of skills to put into a game of Tag Rugby. Multi-skills: Children will learn a variety of ball skills inc. changing direction, speed and control against opponents.
PSHE	Me and my relationships: Children will learn about rules, co-operation and friendship and coping with loss. Valuing differences: Children will recognise and respect diversity and learn about their local community.

READING

Children should read at least 10 minutes per day, including 3 times a week to an adult.

Reading record books should be signed by an adult when your child has read to you and returned every day with your child's reading book.
